I have just returned from sunny Miami, Florida. I had a great trip, but I am glad to be back home in Tucson.



Tucson and Phoenix Clubs Travel to Superior for Annual Herb Festival

Saturday April 10 was the place to be for copius amounts of good food, light hiking, live music, culinary demonstrations and Corvairs. The Cactus Corvair Club and the Tucson Corvair Association made the Herb Festival their rendevous point for their April mid-month activity. The location is perfect for a gathering of cars and people. Everybody present thought the Boyce Thompson Arboretum location was superior to Picacho Peak, where both clubs met in the past for their annual picnic together.



Just minutes

from Superior, Arizona, the arboretum is a beautful hour and a half drive up Highway 77 and 177 for Tucson drivers and slightly less for Phoenix drivers traveling east on Highway 60. Don Robinson said he likes the trip because he can drive back to Tucson on a different route (Hwy 79) and still avoid the treacherous four-lane Interstate-10.

Many small towns dot the map along the way. A significant part of Arizona's mining industry, towns like Mammoth, Hayden, Kearney, Kelvin, and Winkelman are home to many of the workers employed by the mines. The charm and individuality of Kearney is apparent once you turn off the highway. Nestled near the Dripping Springs Mts. and the Tortilla Mts, the small town (1990 Census: pop-2262) is home to the workers of the Ray Open Pit Copper Mine. Small homes are built on steep slopes.

They exist, however, in a hotbed of environmental controversy. According to the EPA, the Hayden smelter is Arizona's biggest polluter. Residents of Hayden, mostly low-income Hispanics, experience lung cancer rates 50% higher than Tucson or Phoenix.

Tucson, with four Corvairs present, provided the meats for grilling while Phoenix, with three Corvairs, provided all the rest.


