# NEW BANNER FOR TCA EVENTS



On October 2, 2009 the Tucson Corvair Association will be displaying several Corvairs at O'Rielly Chevrolet. The Corvair was officially introduced to the public on October 2, 1959 - a short 50 years earlier to the day. The Board of Directors decided a Corvair banner would be a nice addition to our club banner and a banner was purchased that could be used not only at the 50th anniversary display but at almost any event that the club attends. The banner measures about 8 feet wide by 2 feet high and is printed on high-quality vinyl. It has a pocket on each end so a poll can slide through, flaps cut into the banner's surface to allow wind to pass though, and several metal gromets for securing it. A stand was fabricated that holds the banner just above the roof-level of your average Corvair. The stand will break down for easy transport and the banner can be rolled up on a roller for safe storage.

## NEW MEETING PLACE

Over the passed few years we have been kicked around from place to place in search of a spot to call home for our monthly meetings. President Lynn Marrs called the meeting to order at 6:59pm.

**Approval of the Minutes for July:** Motion to approve the July minutes was made by Van Pershing, seconded by Don Robinson and unanimously carried. Bill Maynard asserted he has not been on any benders recently.

President's Report: President Lynn Marrs announced that this years Christmas Party will again be held at Cody's Beef & Beans on Ft. Lowell Boulevard. Reservation of the facility has been made for Friday, December 11th. Members were reminded to arrive with a can of food for the food drive and a gift for the white elephant gift exchange. 
### Warren H. Anderson and his Cartifacts

From 1956 to 1986 Warren H. Anderson was a Professor of Art at the University of Arizona in Tucson. He grew up in Moline, Illinois, the famous home of John Deere, and the Velie Automobile Company. After enlisting in the U.S. Navy in World War II, he received degrees from Western Illinois University, the State

University of Iowa, and a Ph.D from Stanford University. He was one of the first art teachers hired to teach in the new three-story brick art building

on Vine Avenue and Speedway. He said the building was so new when he started that the floors were still dirt when classes began in 1956. He mostly taught art education, but every once in a while he would focus on everyday American life and the subject that would keep him busy for many years: the car.

His most frequent subjects were vintage cars, gas pumps, signs, motel and diner neon. His later work featured neon signs gleaned from the old roads of his own mind... imaginary highwayssince the originals have all but vanished. His book *Vanishing Roadside America*, 1981, was all too prophetic.



Secret Side Show Survivor, Georgia (11 7/8" x 7 7/8")


He employed his prismatic pencils to reveal "Cartifacts"

along America's formerly major highways... from coast to coast. Cartifacts is a neologism he conferred on all those artifacts in our built environment, ranging in scale from tint to tremendous, that exist because of cars. As a concept, it sustained the creative artist for his entire artistic life.


He devoted many years to documenting signs and objects from along "Roadside America." "I have come to feel a responsibility for the preservation of these rapidly disappearing vestiges of a vernacular American art form and a more leisurely mode of travel." Air Cooled Waterfall in the Desert harkens to the 1930s with its softly rounded edges and letters. It seems in harmony with the waterfall styled headboards and dressers found inside the rooms of this desert motel.

Not to be construed as air conditioned, swamp coolers as they were called in those days were worth every penny of the cost of the room in this mid-1930s tourist court: \$1.25 a night.
