Chevy Showdown 2014 It rained on our parade, but we had a good time!

The day was windy and, in the end, got a little damp, but the event was well attended by the Tucson Corvair community. In all there were only about 80 cars at the Chevy Showdown held on April 26, 2014. Ten of those were Corvairs. In attendance were Ken Farr with his '64 Tweety car and his 'red '67 Monza convertible. Jim Mills brought the Rampside and his '63 convertible, Van Pershing came with the Stinger clone, Frank Trejo came with his '62 Monza coupe, Ron Bloom showed up with his Greenbrier, Sam Pernu was there with his '65 convertible, John and Amy Young brought their beautiful '65 Monza 140hp coupe, Frank Pella, a non-TCA member, was there again with his '68 convertible.

As in the past, several TCA assisted the Classic Chevy Club of Tucson with some of the show logistics. Parking and judging were our assigned tasks for this year's show.

Every Corvair took home an award this year except John and Amy Young who opted to not have the Monza coupe judged and Sam Pernu who had to leave the show before the judging started. Because some of the judging classes have been very poorly attend over the passed several years, the CCCT officials decided to shift some of the Corvairs into other classes for judging purposes. For example, there were not entries in the '65-'73 Modified class, so Van Pershing's Stinger was shifted into that class. Ken Farr's Tweety was shifted into the '58-'64 Modified class, and his '67 convertible went into the '65-'72 Stock Appearing class.

Jim Wheeler, president of CCCT, says they are going to make some changes for next year. "Among many other changes, I'd like us to have at least two classes for Corvairs next year. We could combine them into one or two classes.

Minutes from the April meeting were unanimously approved.

The Mt Lemmon picnic was discussed. Those who attended enjoyed the General Hitchcock site and even enjoyed trying to keep up with Bill Maynard in his Lakewood.

The Chevy Showdown was also discussed. There was a great turn out from the Corvair ranks; probably the biggest group at the show with maybe the exception of the tri-five Chevys. The voting for the non-Corvair award that the Club gave was very close. The winner was a beautiful '69 Z-28 with a green El Camino coming in a close second. The after-show BBQ at the Mills' was not very well attended due to the rain, but everyone had a nice time.

No progress has been made to the new T-shirt project due to Van Pershing inability to make contact with the graphic designer who has did our last T-shirt design.

President Lake suggested that we start a parts exchange list. Those who are working on projects could make a list of parts they need and give other sin the Club the chance to dispose of parts that they may not have a use for.

Van Pershing presented the potential new Chevy Showdown rules for the Corvair class for future Shows. The Classic Chevy Club of Tucson, sponsor of the Showdown, is proposing that the Corvair class be eliminated and the Corvairs be placed in the '58-'64 "regular" Chevrolet stock appearing and modified classes and the '65-'72 stock appearing and modified classes. The proposal is stems from the fact that those classes have had very poor participation in the passed several years. If the Corvairs are placed in those classes it would mean that early and late models would not be competing with each other and the "regular Chevys would still have a place to go. This year the CCCT had several of the expensive award plaques left over.

Treasure's Report. The balance as of April 1, 2014 was \$2,291.59 with a balance as of April 30, 2014 of \$2,183.94. The report was unanimously approved.

Website/newsletter report was given by Van Pershing. All is going smoothly. Suggestions for improvement were ask for but everyone present was happy with the present status.

Upcoming Activities: June 7 will be an evening at the Gaslight Theater. It was suggested that folks get their tickets soon as they have a tendency to be sold out. Those attending will meet at the theater at 6pm and park the Corvair together. On July 19 the Club will bring their Corvairs to the Little Anthony's Diner Car Show. The Madera Canyon picnic will be held on September 27. Everyone is also invited to bring their cars to the Nam Jam show on September 20.

After a brief intermission the raffle was held. Sam Pernu and Mike lake held the winning tickets.

Bob Moulton showed some carburetors that he is prepar-

ing to put on one of his projects. These unit were a bit unusual in that the choke pull-offs were cast metal instead of the usual plastic ones. He brought a copy of Bob Helt's book on the H series Rochester carburetors. A discussion followed about the use of vacuum gauges to balance and tune Corvair carburetors.

The meeting adjourned at 7:57pm.

(continued from page 1) probably the 1958-64 and 1965-72 Stock Appearing and Modified classes. There were only four entries in those classes this year where 12 trophies were to be assigned. That was before we shifted some of the Corvairs into those four classes", says Wheeler. This would make it so early and late models are not competing against each other and separate modified cars from stock appearing cars. Nobody supports the Showdown more than the Tri-Fives ('55, '56 and '57 Chevy cars) and the Corvairs, so it only makes sense to shift the classes to allow more variety for the Corvairs like has been done for the Tri-Fives

One of the highlights of the Show was the presentation of the Corvair Award. The Club decided to give a TCA's Choice Award to our favorite non-Corvair vehicle.
