### WILL THE CORVAIR KILL YOU?

A review of an article by Larry Webster that appeared in the spring 2017 issue of the Hagerty Insurance magazine.

Larry Webster, who has decades of experience in racing and testing cars, Takes a '60 Corvair for a little drive on the concrete runway at Detroit's Coleman Young Airport. He's a little nervous about what he's about to do having just read Nader's *Unsafe At Any Speed* that refers to the Corvair as a "one-car accident".

Larry had always wondered if Nader's claims were fair. Pete Kohler, a fellow CORSA member and former GM engineering says the Corvair wasn't inherently flawed, it was just different.

Larry states that even through his outrage Nader actually made some sense, "He wrote about dashboards freckled with sharp knobs", etc. But Larry still wondered about the Corvair.

So he forgot about all the controversy and focused on the machine itself. It was born at a time when General



Motors was the king of carmakers with over 50 percent of the market share in the U.S. and the Corvair was their attempt to anticipate the future. It was meant to be a compact car cleverly engineered to provide lots of interior space by placing the engine in the rear. The Corvair was a complete rethink of the automobile and three years ahead of the Porsche 911. Larry says that if Elon Musk of Solar-City, SpaceX and Tesla fame would have been behind it he would considered a genius!

As Larry drove the Corvair around the runway for the first time he was surprised how small and agile it felt. Compared to his '55 Ford Country Squire. The Corvair is a Ferrari and it was fun! Larry's article was refreshing. Here's a guy who had no real contact with Corvairs before and stepped into test driving the car, researching the car's history, interviewed engineers that actually helped develop the car, took into account the other automobiles of the era and how they compared, and then drew his unbiased conclusions based on his finding. He didn't conclude that the Corvair was a "killer car" nor did he profess it to be the best designed car ever to hit the road. His report was "fair and balanced", as they say.

He concluded by saying, "As for my experience behind the wheel? I'm shopping."
