CONCOURS PREP: PART 1

Entering your Corvair in a contest with other Corvairs can affect you in many ways. Yes, it is fun. It can also be frustrating and nerve testing. However, most of all, it is hard work, time consuming, and sometimes even expensive. It all depends on you, your goals and your outlook.

Lets take a hard look at the Concours de Elegance. There is usually a field of 25 or less vehicles, but large or small, all Eoncours events are judged the same or should be. If any one point is of prime importance, it is cleanliness. Keep in mind, you could have a Corvair straight off the assembly line, but if it is dusty and dirty, you would lose points.

Okay - you've decided to give it a try. Go out to your car in broad daylight taking a pad and pencil with you. Be strict and honest with yourself when jotting down all areas that need attention.

Start by looking at the undercarriage. Is the entire bottom clean, free from rust, oil and grease? Is the steering tight? How are the ball joints? If your steering wheel has free play or four or more inches you probably have worn parts in the steering system. Do judges look at this item? - You bet!

Get down on your hands and knees just ahead of the rear tire and look up above the transaxle. How much oil, grease, or dirt is up there? Also in this position, you can see if your valve covers are leaking.

Don't forget to write down all of your discoveries on that pad you have with you.

Go to the rear of your car and again squat down. Pushing open the two air exhaust flaps, check those passages. If there is oil in there, you have a common problem. Corvairs can leak oil from many places, but the most likely spots for leaks are the seals on the push rod tubes (inside the valve covers). That means the 0 rings should be replaced.

Another place could be the seal between the engine and transmission. Now here the leak could be wither oil or transmission fluid. You can determine which seal is leaking by smell. Transmission fluid has a very different odor from engine oil it's more pungent.

Keep in mind now that even a very small leak will show up somewhere. A leak from the front of the engine may show up at the rear because as the car moves forward, the air movement pushes the leaking fluid to the rear and it gathers there rather than at the point of the leak.

Also while you are looking underneath, check your brake fluid lines closely. Any bends or kinks? Look at the inside of all four wheels. Check for leaks with fluid dripping downward and perhaps over the tires. This is a sure sign of a failing brake cylinder. Now open your engine lid. Cleanliness! Don't forget the judges will always be looking for cleanliness. When cleaning, check around the battery. White powder on the hold-downs and/or the clamps should not be there. Baking soda in water will do an excellent job of neutralizing the acid present. Of course, you should also take the battery out and wash the battery and battery compartment.

The spark plug wires and boots should be in good shape and in place. This is only good sense. Check around the bases of the carburetors for dirt and possible gasoline leaks. The toughest place to keep clean is ahead of and below the fuel pump. It is no fun getting down in there and judging from the accumulation of oil and debris I've seen, very few people clean there.

Go to the trunk. Is it all scratched and is the paint worn in spots? The most troublesome place is under the mat. Usually it is covered with rust. Rust in the trunk comes from a faulty rubber moulding between the trunk lid and the trunk itself. Wald around and look at all the rubber mouldings on the doors, engine and trunk lids. Dry, cracked, or chewed-up mouldings should be replaced.

Are you writing all these things down? Okay, here is a toughie! The exterior body. Look closely at poor paint, color, mismatch, scratches, dents and nicks. You play the judge. Along with the body goes the bumpers and all the chrome trim. Most of the trim is made of aluminum. If you are extremely careful, you can take minor dents and dings from them. Remove from the car and use a piece of soft wood inside the damaged part. Then gently using a hammer, you can tap our most all of the dents.
