



## MOTOR OIL GUIDE

The American Petroleum Institute (API) has classified and identified oil according to its use. The API service recommendations are listed on top of the oil can and all car manufacturers use API letters to indicate recommended oils.

Almost all oils meet or exceed the highest service rating (SE), but viscosity should be selected to match the highest anticipated temperature before the next oil change.

S = GASOLINE C = DIESEL

API SYMBOL	USE & DEFINITION	
S F	SF is the most severe service. It is an improved version of SE quality oil with improved oxidation stability and anti-wear quality. It will likely replace SE oil in time.	
S E	SE is recommended for use in all 4-cycle gasoline engines, and cars used for stop and start or high speed, long distance driving. It has increased detergency and can withstand higher temperatures, while providing maximum protection against corrosion, rust and oxidation. Meets all service requirements for classifications SD, SC, SB and SA.	
S D (formerly MS 1968)	These oils provide more protection against rust, corrosion and oxidation than oils classified SC. Meets minimum gasoline engine warranties in effect from 1968-70.	
S C (formerly MS 1964)	These oils control rust and corrosion and retard the formation of high and low temperature deposits and meets minimum warranty requirements in effect for 1964-67 gasoline engines.	
S B (formerly MM)	These oils have anti-scuff properties and will slow down oxidation and corrosion. Oils designed for this service afford minimum protection under moderate operating conditions.	
S A (formerly ML)	These oils have no protective properties and have no performance requirements.	
C D (formerly DS)	These oils provide protection from high temperature deposits and bearing corrosion in diesel engines used in severe service.	
C C (formerly DM)	These oils provide protection from rust, corrosion and high temperature deposits in diesel engines used in moderate to severe service.	
C B (formerly DM)	These oils are designed to provide protection from bearing corrosion and deposits from diesel engines using high sulphur fuel. Service is meant for engines used in mild to moderate service with lower quality fuels.	
C A (formerly DG)	This is a general diesel service classification. These oils should not be used when sulphur content of fuel exceeds 0.4%. Oils will provide protection from bearing corrosion when high quality fuels are used.

#### HOT WEATHER PROBLEMS ?

Every once in a while I hear Frank McKenna telling somebody about how they can fix their carburetors to solve hot weather starting problems - and he always says "and I'll get you the instructions on where to drill the hole...." I don't know if this is the same hole Frank always talks about, but here is a copy of the Chevrolet Service bulletin that talks about it and now that the really hot weather is upon us.......(some of you will say that this guy is a few months late, but I prefer to think of it as a few months EARLY!!!)

## Difficult Hot Engine Re-Starting—1963 Corvair (Except Turbocharged Models) and Corvair "95"

(TSB #885 DR #589 MAY 1, 1963)

Corvair and Corvair "95" engines may be subject to difficult re-starting after the engine has been shut off when hot, for a short period of time. This condition is the result of fuel vapors accumulating in the induction system of the engine.




Fig. 5—Drilling Carburetor Vent Hole

Hot starting time may be reduced considerably by drilling a 1/8" diameter hole through the body of each carburetor as illustrated in Figure 5 to provide a vent.

CAUTION: This vent hole is not recommended for vehicles operating in extremely dusty areas.
