
Big Ed Sez----

TECH NOTES

"Dad, you've got no stoplights!"

Blast. What's with this car? Put on troubleshooting hat. Turn on ignition and check turn signals. They work, so bulbs and wiring to rear of car are OK. Move to under dash. Hook up light-on-pigtails. 12 volts on hot side - check other side. Push brake pedal - yep, it lights, so switch is OK. Disconnect connectors to turn signal - power goes in, but doesn't come out. Double Blast. Plan A, replace turn signal switch. Check Clarks for price. GASP. Plan B, repair existing switch. Remove steering wheel, etc, etc, and finally remove switch. Check for continuity with ohmmeter. Hm - continuity through turn signal switches is OK, but nothing through brake light terminal. Nothing is broke - Oh, well pull out contacts and clean and try again. Hm - still nothing. It seems as though that little brake light terminal is cruddy - cruddy? Picture me hanging head in shame. A few gentle strokes with a swiss needle file got rid of the epoxy, and the switch was fully operational again. Put it all back together and smile at the operational brake lights.

Epoxy? Yep - a couple of weeks ago the turn signal switch broke, and I fixed it with epoxy, while it was still mounted in the car. Excess epoxy squeezed out the back of the cancelling arm, and a (really) small amount made contact. Not enough to lock up the arm so it couldn't move, but obviously enough to insulate the brake light terminal. I checked it right after the repair, and it worked (the brake lights), but maybe the epoxy migrated, or a sliver broke off, or who knows - Moral: when signal cancelling arm breaks, and repair is decided upon, remove switch from car to repair.
