



The minutes of February 23, 1983 regular meeting as published in the Corvairsation were approved.

There are new ACP catalogues available for \$2.00 each.

A letter was received from Gail Albani, Arizona Representative of the Automobile Lobbyist Council. Senate Bill #1301 - "vehicle Transfer Tax." An arbitrary committee should not decide the actual value of our cars. Bill #2312 - "Mandatory Child Restraint." This bill requires seat belts in all cars. We would like an exemption for older cars that did not come equipped with seat belts. Bill #HB2509 - "Motor Vehicle Annual Safety Inspection Act." Part of the bill requires a car to be in perfect running condition before it can be sold. She requested members to write or call their Congressman or Representative in objection to these bills and we would more than likely get some action. You can also send a Personal Opinion Message with 20 words or less for a nominal fee.

Following break, grab bag and door prizes were given with the winners being Bob Eggers, Chris Cunningham, Frank McKenna, Dr. Neil Clements, Barry Cunningham, Alan Atwood and Gloria Gray.

Guest, Mr. M. S. "Rosy" Rosenberger, showed a news journal entitled "Concerning Cars" which has a lot of information in the public interest and is all about litegation. An article of interest was a case history of the Corvair.

Sale items and technical tip sessions followed.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

BYLAWS - Part III

This is the final part of our presentation of the TCA Bylaws. If you have the last two issues of the Corvairsation plus the issue you are presently reading, then you have a complete set of the Bylaws as they presently stand.

ARTICLE VI -- Meetings and Activities

1. Meetings

The TCA shall hold a minimum of eleven monthly meetings each year. The February meeting shall include the election of officers for the following year. Board of Director meetings shall be held each month/ or at the direction of the President.

2. Activities

The TCA shall conduct a minimum of 10 scheduled activities each year.

3. A quorum shall consist of those members present at a scheduled membership meeting.

ARTICLE VII -- Newsletter

- 1. The TCA newsletter shall be named the Corvairsation.
- 2. The Corvairsation shall be published monthly and mailed to each member.
- 3. An editor shall be appointed by the President with the concurrence of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII -- Ammendments

1. Ammendments of these Bylaws may be made at any regular meeting of the membership by a vote of 2/3 of the membership present, providing notice of the matter to be voted has been published in the newsletter prior to the meeting.

ARTICLE IX -- Committees and Appointees

1. Appointees

The President, with concurrence of a majority of the Board of Directors, shall appoint: Corvairsation Editor, Membership Chairman, Historian, Publicity Chairman and Technical Coordinator.

2. Committees

Special committees shall be appointed as needed. The committees shall serve until the project is completed, or until the end of the program year.


14011078 Small-block V8/V6-90

The True Meaning of Life

A lot of attention is being given these days to handling in the automotive circles. It hasn't been untill just recently that road tests in the automotive magazines have included some figures which indicate a car's handling ability. The figure that is used is called lateral acceleration and is expressed in "g's". I g is equal to the force of the earth's gravity. Lateral acceleration is usually measured by means of a steady-state constant-radius turn performed on a smooth surface such as a skidpad. The vehicle being tested is run in a circle which is usually from 100 to 400 feet in diameter. The vehicle is run in the circle at increasing speed untill the turning radius can no longer be maintained. The vehicle is run several laps in each direction and the resulting lap times are averaged and plugged into the following formula:

$$LA = \frac{1.225 \times R}{T^2}$$

Where: LA = Lateral Acceleration, in "g's"

R = Radius of the circle in feet, measured at the centerline of the vehicle

T = Lap time. in seconds

If the result is 1.0 g, that means that the cornering forse generated by the vehicle is equal to the force of the earth's gravity - the cornering force is pulling on the car from the side as much as gravity is pulling it to the road. Most expensive sports cars such as Porches, etc. are in the .80g range. Your average family sedan is in the .6 to .7g range. The new Corvette is pushing .95g and the lowly Corvair, which was designed back in the days when nobody even cared enough to measure lateral acceleration, can easily be in the .7 to .8 range with little or no trouble.

I don't know what this all means, but I sure would like to have a new Corvette to park in the garage next to my Corsa!






