


### BYLAYS AMMENDMENTS TO BE VOTED ON

The following are proposed changes to the Bylaws of the Tucson Corvair Association. Ammendments to the Bylaws are to be voted on at a regular meeting and must pass by a 2/3 vote of members present. The proposed ammendments must also be published in the Corvairsation prior to the meeting.

- 1) Article VI, section 2. Activities, now reads: "The TCA shall conduct a minimum of 10 scheduled activities each year." The proposed change would read: "The TCA shall schedule and organize a minimum of 10 activities each year."
- 2) There is presently no provision for the Board of Directors in the area of the size of a quorum, therefore under Article VI, a new section is proposed: "4. A quorum of the Board of Directors shall consist of a majority of the current Board Members."

The above listed ammendment proposals will be voted on at the next regular meeting of the Tucson Corvair Association which will be held on May 25, 1983 at 7:30pm at the regular meeting place.
