

As host club for the 1984 CORSA National Convention, NJACE is deeply and excitedly involved in the planning for what promises to be a most fun-filled and gratifying event for all you Corvair addicts.

Parsippany, New Jersey is nestled adjacent to Interstate Highways 80 and 287 near Morristown, is 20 minutes from midtown Manhattan, yet is only a short distance from some of the most beautiful rural areas in the East. 
As you know, Bob Thompson, the membership chairman has been transfered by I.B.M. to Charolette, North Carolina. He is now working in Boca Raton, Fl. until July or Aug. when the job moves to Charolette permanently. I will continue to mail out the Corvairsations and collect club dues until someone else volunteers for the job, or until the end of May.

Maybe not so SHOCKING after all.....

In the January 1984 issue of the Corsa Communique, Larry Claypool submitted an article entitled "Shocking facts about replacement shocks". In the article he stated that the shock length was very critical on early model cars and all Greenbrier/Corvans because the shock is the only thing that stops the travel of the rear suspension when its on its downward stroke. He went into some detail about the angles of travel, etc., etc. which was very informative. One point that he made was with regard to the length of the shock as measured in the sketch below. "The correct extended length", he stated, "is 12 3/4" for early cars and 13 1/4" for trucks." He then went on to say that if the shocks were too long that washers could be installed between the lower control arm and the mounting flange of the shock (also shown in the sketch below.)

With information in hand, I started shopping for shocks. I looked and looked and nowhere could I find anything that met my criteria. So I pulled the old shocks off the Lakewood to see what was there. The car showed 80,000 miles and had been setting for the past 10 years, so the shocks on the 1961 car were really only 11 years old if they were the OEM issue. They were so worn that by simply turning them upside down the shafts would fully extend. They were Delco and I believe they were the shocks that were installed at the factory. If they weren't, they were certainly the correct replacement because they were still available in those days. They measured an even 14". I then found a set of Delco Pleasurizers that were listed for the early cars (P-1105) and guess what? They measure exactly 14". Upon installing them on the car. there was plenty of slack left in the brake lines so there is no danger of breakage there and the car handles just fine. I can't speak for the trucks but there's certainly nothing wrong with 14" shock length - save your washers!





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
