

INSTALLING GREASE FITTINGS — '65 - '69 CARS

It is super-easy to install grease fittings in the rear wheel bearings of '65 to '69 cars. All you have to do is remove the two rear wheels and remove the two rear brake drums. You don't even have to take the brakes off. I simply wrap masking tape around the drill bit so I won't cut into the lower brake return spring, coat the drill bit with axle grease to contain the drill filings, and drill one hole in each axle bearing housing.

Next, I tap a hole with a grease-covered tap, and vacuum away any metal filings from the holes. Then I install the grease fittings and fill the housings with grease from my hand-pump grease gun. It takes exactly fifty-five (55) full strokes from my grease gun to fill the cavity with axle grease. Then I put the brake drums and wheels back on the car and go for a test drive.

The car seems to ride 10% smoother and quieter after greasing the rear wheel bearings. But, be aware of the fact that if metal chips happen to get inside of the housing during the drilling and tapping operation, they could cause wheel bearing damage later on. Reasonable care should prevent this from happening.


