ONE 12 VOLT BULB WITH TWO LEADS AND CLIPS

 REMOVE DISTRIBUTOR CAP AND ROTOR. CLUE - NEAR COIL, FOLLOW THE LEAD.

> SEE THAT BREAKER GAP IS SET TO SPECIFICATIONS CLUE - OLD VAIRS NEW POINTS 0.019" USED POINTS 0.016" DWELL 0.031° - 0.034° VOLKSDWELL - 91 CENTIPEDES

 ROTATE ENGINE UNTIL NO.1 CYLINDER IS AT THE IGNITION TIMING POINT AS INDICATED BY THE TIMING POINTER AND TIMING MARK BEING LINED UP WITH EACH OTHER.

> CLUE - OLD VAIRS STANDARD TRANSMISSION 4 DEGREES POWERSLIDE 13 DEGREES MUSTANGS (SEE ERTL. INSTRUCTIONS)

- CONNECT THE JUMPER LIGHT BETWEEN THE DISTRIBUTOR IGNITION TERMINAL AND GROUND (TRY THE + ON THE COIL).
- 4. TURN ON IGNITION SWITCH (USE KEYS)
