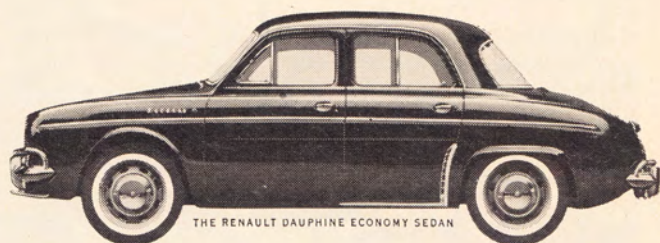




Now that Renault is automatic, how do you get a stick shift?
